Results will be used to inform decision-making related to the effectiveness of pedagogical methods of presentation of the material.
Upon completing this course, students will know general counseling principles applicable to the local church based on the integration of theological and psychological foundations.	One case study paper on the utilization of one model in pastoral care counseling.	100% of students will perform at proficiency on all means of evaluation.	N = 11, there are 11 students enrolled in the course. 10/11 or 90% received at least 100% and above.	Results will be used to inform decision-making related to the pedagogical methods to engage and train students in reseach.
